

COMET KILSTROM, 1966b.

This notice is being sent to only a few active members of the Comet and Nova Section, and to a few others who may have a special interest.

I.A.U. Card no. 1964 reports the discovery of this comet by Mr. Stephen Kilstrom last week. The following position, magnitude, and motion was given.

Mr. David Levy of the Montreal Centre, R.A.S.C., observed this comet on the night of August 13/14 at 03:30 and 04:30 U.T., and reports the following very approximate data:

Hourly motion	0	-1'	

Mr. Levy reports that at 90x, the comet looks like a star slightly out of focus, and that at 435x, it appears as a pound of nebulous patch.

From these reports, the following search ephemeris was prepared, assuming a constant rate of change during the next week. It could be in considerable error.
