Two of the early chapters are given over to atomic and nuclear physics, and to applications of physics to astronomy. Five chapters go to a discussion of the Earth, Moon, Sun, and Planets. A further five chapters are devoted to the Stars—giant Stars, Dwarfs, exploding Stars. The book then broadens still more into a discussion of the whole Milky Way, and of other star systems like the Milky Way—the galaxies. In Chapters 13 to 17, this discussion takes in the origin of galaxies and the birth of stars. The new branch of astronomy known as radio astronomy is also considered in its important applications.

Of the last three chapters, one is concerned with the different modern theories of the Universe; another considers how the several theories may be verified or disproved by direct observation; and the last chapter of all looks ahead

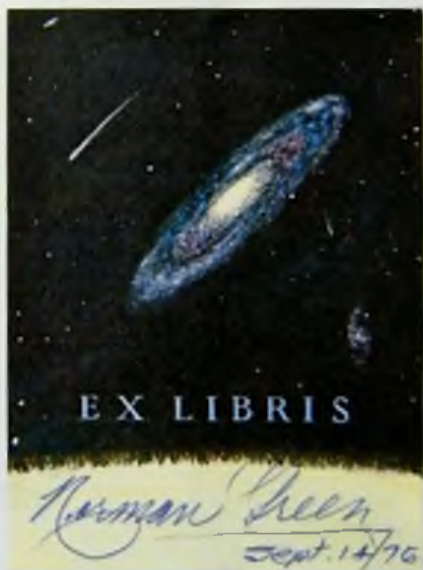

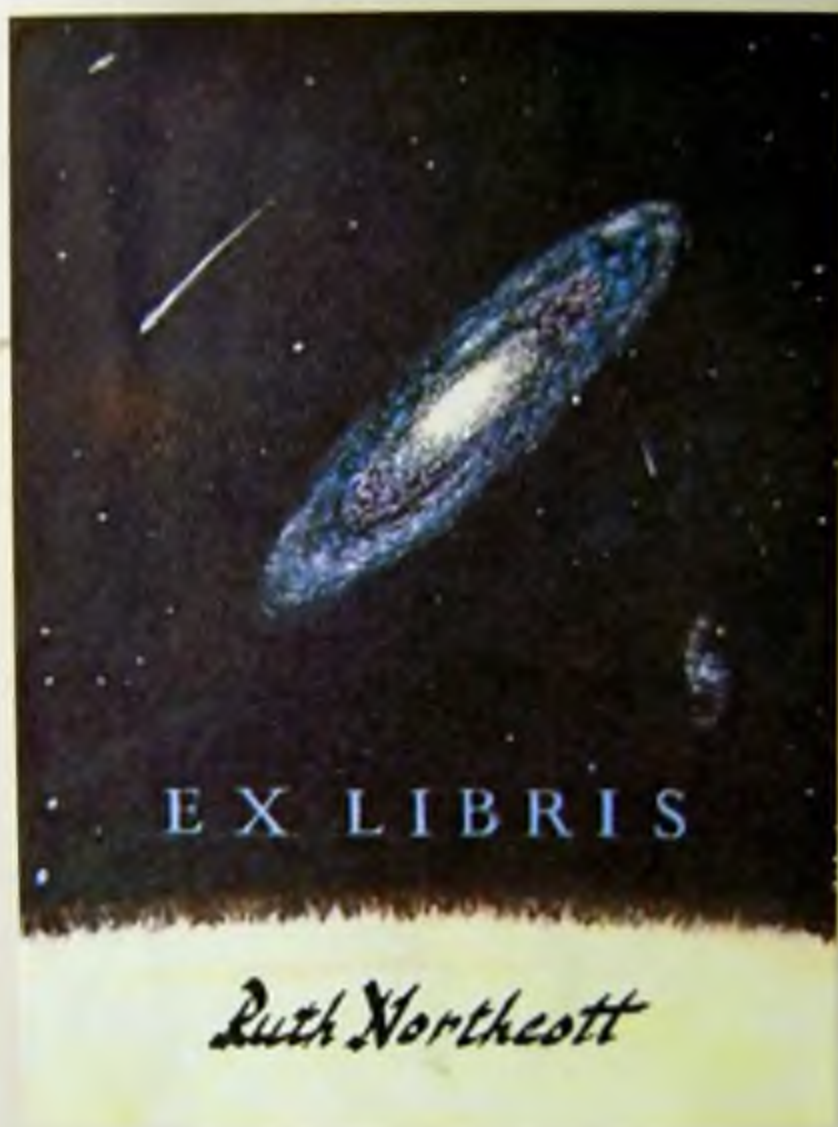

Plate IV shows the general
pattern, except that mine
will be a 15 inch, instead
of 12. There will be attached
to the telescope, about the
