Two of the early chapters are given over to atomic and nuclear physics, and to applications of physics to astronomy. Five chapters go to a discussion of the Earth, Moon, Sun, and Planets. A further five chapters are devoted to the Stars—giant Stars, Dwarfs, exploding Stars. The book then broadens still more into a discussion of the whole Milky Way, and of other star systems like the Milky Way—the galaxies. In Chapters 13 to 17, this discussion takes in the origin of galaxies and the birth of stars. The new branch of astronomy known as radio astronomy is also considered in its important applications.

Of the last three chapters, one is concerned with the different modern theories of the Universe; another considers how the several theories may be verified or disproved by direct observation; and the last chapter of all looks ahead from the present position to problems that are still unsolved.

The instrument has not yet been sent, because Cassini wanted to clean it up before sending. I hope to get it off to-day.

To describe the instrument ordered in Newfoundland for you benefit and that

Plate IV shows the general
pattern, except that mine
will be a 15 inch, instead
of 12. There will be attached
to the telescope, about the
middle, a camera having
8 inch lens. The camera
will be about 4 feet long.

There will be two finders
instead of one — one to be of
4 inches aperture, the other
of $2\frac{1}{2}$. On the north side of
the stand will be a dial for
setting the instrument to
Swiss right ascension or
hour angle.

The form of the position

3 micrometer is shown in Plate V. A similar micrometer is shown attached to the Lick Telescope in Plate XXII.

There will be a spectrograph with three prisms, and a grating arranged for either visual or photographic work. The appearance of this attachment when used with the prisms for photography will be seen in Plate XXII. There is also a wedge photometer.

The price of all is \$ 14,625.

It is to be delivered next spring by which time I hope the building will be ready to receive it. The place chosen for the observatory is on the Experimental Farm which will afford an excellent site.
